

- 1. The language of the poem is distinctive in its use of verbs. Scan the verses and identify the types of verbs used. Can you suggest why they fit the scene?
- 2. Football is a team game; each player depends on his fellow. Can you find an example of a simile that seems to describe unity of action?



- 3. Which metaphor seems to reflect the predominant imagery of Cock-Crows? Why does Hughes choose it?
- 4. The fourth and fifth verses seem to mark a change in atmosphere. Can you suggest how this change occurs?
- 5. The seventh verse begins with a co-ordinating conjunction. Can you explain how the tone changes again in this verse?
- 6. The final verse, as is common in much of Hughes' poetry, leaves us puzzled and questioning the poem's overall meaning.
 - a) What is the 'golden holocaust'? What does the adjective suggest is being described?
 - b) Why does it watch these young men *again*? (What technique is being used here?)
- 7. How would you describe the attitude of the speaker to the footballers?
- 8. What is the overall impact of this poem upon the reader?
